CROSS-COUNTRY RACE THRILLS.

Lancaster Harriers' Bid For Lead.

The third contest in connection with the Mid-Lancashire Cross-country Running League run from Leyland Motors sports ground on Saturday, produced the most thrilling harriers' team race seen over the Leyland course.

The 56 runners represented the league champions, Clayton Harriers, Lancaster Harriers and Athletic Club, Preston Harriers, Leyland Motors Athletic Club, and Rossendale Harriers. Trail took them over about 7½ miles of pasture, woodland and stubble via Leyland loss striking the fields at Worden Park to Runshaw Moor, prossing the Preston-Wigan road at Euxton and over the rising country to Whittle-le-Woods, and

on to Clayton Bottoms, before the return was made across <u>country</u> for home via Turpin Green Bridge.

The dry going and an exhilarating high wind rendered conditions ideal for fast running.

The pack got going to a perfect start, E. T. Shepherd, Lancaster, set a hot pace, and after the first mile had got clear of the field, and at the Euxton road prossing he gave the spectators plenty to enthuse over by establishing a 100 yards' lead over A. Haydock, of Clayton, to cover the first three miles, which included several water jumps, in 19min.

Next in order were Hayes, Clayton; Edmundson, Lancaster, and Blogg, Leyland Motors. At the next check, a little over half distance. Shepherd, still running strong, had increased his lead to 150 yards in 28min.

At this stage a great struggle was taking place between Lancaster and Clayton for team supremacy, with the latter's counters holding a slight advantage in the first 20. The Clayton team proved the better stayers, and placing their six men in the first dozen to finish, ran out winners, with the lowest average points scored in the league competition this season.

Lancaster gained consolation in the fine running of Shepherd, who gained individual honours, to complete the course in 47min 5sec., a minute ahead of Haydock; A. Edmundson, Lancaster, was third, 48min. 10sec.
